The 5 Ws and 1 H

- What, Why, When, Where, Who and How?
- Basic information-gathering questions. By 1917, the "5 Ws" were being taught in journalism classes and by 1940 it was considered "old fashioned" to include all 5 in the first paragraph of a news story.
